



What is a National Heritage Area

- Official Definition: A place where natural, cultural, historic and scenic resources combine to form a cohesive, nationally important landscape arising from patterns of human activity shaped by geography.
- Political Definition: any place so designated by Congress.
- Personal: When you're in it, you can feel it.

- Northeast-17
- Southeast-9
- Midwest-6
- Intermountain-4
- Pacific West-1

Statistics of the 37 NHA's

- NHA's in 27 States (54%)
- 288,000 square miles in counties with NHA's (10% of US).
- 137 Congressional Districts with NHA's (32%)
- 61,736,000 people live in counties with NHA's (22% of US population).
- 16,170 National Register listings (19%).
- 620 National Historic Landmark sites (25%).

Growth of Program

- Moving West
- More Diverse
- Closer coordination with 70+ National Park Sites
- Closer coordination with other Federal Programs (FHWA)

Purposes of Canal Construction-1845

- Power Production (Hydro Mechanical then Hydropower)
- Transportation
- Public Water Supply

Canal TE Projects

- Canal Master Plan-\$200,000 (Fed. \$150,000)
- Phase of Trail-\$1,200,000 (Fed. \$1,000,000)
- Phase III of Trail-\$1,400,000 (Fed. \$825,000)
- Phase IV of Trail-\$850,000 (Fed. \$600,000)
- Petersburg Boats/Docks-\$972,931-Fed. \$500,000)
